

Course Description

ARC1115 | Architectural Communications 1 | 2.00 credits

Exercises in freehand drawing, sketching and linear perspective are designed to increase the student's awareness of the architectural environment. This is accomplished through a series of form studies of nature, architectural forms, and abstract elements of composition. Corequisite: IND1020.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate an ability to communicate graphically by:

- 1. Becoming familiar with drawing and graphic tools
- 2. Developing a consistent drawing process
- 3. Maintaining a clean and presentable drawing ethic

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate knowledge of drawing skills by:

- 1. Performing in- class graphic exercises
- 2. Participating in the discussion of craft and quality of graphics
- 3. Addressing the instructor's constructive criticism on their drawing progress
- 4. Completing graphic assignments and projects.

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate awareness of the physical environment by:

- 1. Creating object contour studies
- 2. Developing figure/ground compositions
- 3. Developing abstract graphic exercises
- 4. Conducting verbal presentations of their work

Competency 4: The student will communicate three- dimensional subjects by:

- 1. Drawing representations of still -life objects
- 2. Drawing representations of scenery
- 3. Creating a composition employing the horizon and vanishing points
- 4. Locating objects within the depth of field using proportional relationships
- 5. Applying shading and texture to represent light and shadow in a three-dimensional composition

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Demonstrate an appreciation for aesthetics and creative activities
