ART1803C | Workshop for ART Research and Practice: Studio | 6.00 credits

Small enrollment sections. Interdisciplinary, team teaching, introductory studio experience in a wide variety of media. In-depth exploration of creative processes, principles of artistic integrity, and the nature of artistic meaning. Concepts in two-dimensional and three-dimensional design will be explored through studio experience.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will conduct an in-depth exploration of creative processes and artistic integrity by:

1. Demonstrating a comprehensive understanding of the creative processes involved in various artistic media, including two-dimensional and three-dimensional design
2. Applying principles of artistic integrity to studio work

1. Engaging in interdisciplinary studio experiences and exploring a wide variety of artistic media to develop a versatile and adaptive approach to artmaking
2. Applying different media to expand creative expression and develop a deeper understanding of their unique properties and potential applications

Competency 3: The student will explore artistic meaning through studio practice by:

1. Analyzing and interpreting the nature of artistic meaning through reflective studio practice, exploring concepts in two-dimensional and three-dimensional design
2. Engaging in critiquing and reflecting on the artistic meaning conveyed through studio work, seeking to enhance the depth and richness of artistic expression
