ART2302C | Advanced Drawing | 3.00 – 4.00 credits

An exploration of varied approaches to drawing through studio problems. May be repeated for credit.
Prerequisites: ART1300C, 1330C.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will apply numerous techniques, processes, and materials in the construction of drawings by:

1. Completing a series of exercises focused on various drawing techniques and materials
2. Applying various techniques to several subjects
3. Developing an artwork that is challenging both conceptually and visually

2. Researching the applications of this terminology
3. Demonstrating the ability to maintain a discourse using this terminology

1. Creating abstract versus figurative patterns
2. Using the different mediums introduced to better convey their concepts
