

Course Description

ART2400C | Printmaking 1 | 3.00 - 4.00 credits

Basic techniques of printmaking including relief prints (woodcut and wood engraving), intaglio (dry point and etching) and lithography. Prerequisite: ART1202C or 1300C.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will have proficiency in basic printmaking techniques by:

- 1. Mastering the fundamental relief printing techniques, including woodcut and wood engraving, to create precise and expressive prints
- 2. Developing proficiency in intaglio methods such as drypoint and etching to produce intricate and textured prints with depth and detail
- 3. Acquiring skills in lithography to create prints using the principles of planographic printing, including plate preparation and image transfer
- 4. Carving and printing relief blocks to create prints demonstrating a command of line, texture, and composition in woodcut and wood engraving
- 5. Utilizing drypoint and etching techniques to produce prints with intricate details, tonal variations, and expressive textures
- 6. Mastering the process of creating and printing lithographic plates, demonstrating an understanding of lithography's unique properties and its application in printmaking

Competency 2: The student will experiment with mixed media and hybrid techniques by:

- 1. Exploring the integration of multiple printmaking techniques to create hybrid prints that combine relief, intaglio, and lithographic elements
- 2. Incorporating and experimenting with unconventional materials and processes to expand the creative possibilities of traditional printmaking methods
- 3. Integrating innovative approaches and mixed media elements to push the boundaries of traditional printmaking and foster artistic experimentation

Competency 3: The student will create hybrid prints that combine relief and intaglio techniques to produce multi-layered and visually dynamic compositions by:

- 1. Incorporating non-traditional materials such as collage, chine-collé, or mixed media elements to enhance the visual impact of printmaking compositions
- 2. Experimenting with the fusion of traditional and contemporary printmaking methods to create innovative and expressive prints that challenge artistic conventions
- 3. Applying of conceptual and technical skills in printmaking
- 4. Applying conceptual and technical skills to translate artistic ideas into compelling printmaking compositions
- 5. Demonstrating proficiency in using printmaking techniques for visual expression and communication of artistic concepts
- 6. Employing critical analysis and reflection to refine printmaking skills and develop a personal artistic style
