

Course Description

ART2750C | Ceramics 1 | 3.00 – 4.00 credits

Basic techniques in pottery design - forming, decorating, glazing and firing. Prerequisites: ART1202C or 1300C.

Course Competencies:

- Exploration of diverse sculptural processes and materials, empowering students to experiment with traditional and contemporary sculptural techniques to refine their artistic practice and expand their creative capabilities
- 3. Empowerment to articulate their artistic concerns with clarity and precision through the mastery of sculptural techniques and materials, fostering a nuanced understanding of the interplay between aesthetics and technical execution in sculptural art
