

## **Course Description**

## ART2949 | Co-op Work Experience 2: ART | 3.00 credits

This is a course designed to continue training in a student's field of study through work experience. Students are graded on the basis of documentation of learning acquired as reported by student and employer. Prerequisite: Co-op Department approval and completion of 1949 Co-op Work Experience. Students will be assigned specific course prefixes related to their academic major prior to registration. All students must contact the Co-operative Education office to obtain registration approval.

## **Course Competencies:**

**Competency 1:** The student will actively engage in learning and acquire new skills, which will be documented and reported by both the student and employer for grading purposes by:

- 1. Applying the knowledge and skills gained from previous coursework to real-world scenarios and projects, actively participating in work tasks and responsibilities
- 2. Acquiring new knowledge, skills, and competencies through hands-on experience and exposure to professional practices within their field of study
- 3. Documenting the learning acquired during work experience, maintaining a record of accomplishments, challenges, and skills developed throughout the course

**Competency 2:** The student will actively demonstrate their learning and growth through work experience, with both the student and employer providing documentation for grading purposes by:

- 1. Showcasing acquired knowledge, skills, and competencies in the student's field of study, demonstrating the ability to apply theoretical concepts and practical techniques to real-world situations
- 2. Evaluating personal growth and development throughout the work experience, reflecting on challenges overcome, lessons learned, and areas for further improvement
- Collaborating with the employer and colleagues to gather feedback and assessments of the student's
  performance, fostering a dialogue and shared understanding of the learning acquired during the work
  experience

**Competency 3:** This course aims to provide a platform for students to actively engage in their field of study, acquiring new knowledge and skills through work experience, and documenting their learning for grading purposes by:

- 1. Expanding the breadth and depth of knowledge within the student's field of study through exposure to real-world projects, tasks, and challenges
- 2. Synthesizing theoretical knowledge and practical skills to address complex problems and tasks encountered during the work experience, demonstrating critical thinking and problem-solving abilities
- 3. Reporting and documenting the learning acquired during the work experience, providing comprehensive and reflective accounts of the skills developed, challenges faced, and accomplishments achieved

## **Learning Outcomes:**

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Demonstrate knowledge of ethical thinking and its application to issues in society
