

Course Description

ASL2210 | ASL Conversational Skills | 3.00 credits

This course will provide practice communication in American Sign Language (ASL). Students will use previously acquired knowledge of ASL vocabulary and linguistic principles to communicate in the language. Prerequisite: ASL1150C or 2160C.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate and practice all aspects of American Sign Language by:

- 1. Performing formal stories and preparing monologues
- 2. Participating in spontaneous dialogues
- 3. Participating in prepared dialogues

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate the effective use of ASL vocabulary by:

- 1. Performing signs accurately, with appropriate speed and fluency
- 2. Performing signs that are conceptually correct for the thought and situation being conveyed
- 3. Demonstrating a command of approximately 1200 sign concepts

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate all components of American Sign Language by:

- 1. Showing appropriate affect, including facial expressions and natural gestures
- 2. Pantomiming and the incorporation of mood and personality
- 3. Using the signing space to convey time, locations, objects, and people
- 4. Using eye gaze for indexing, direct address (discourse), and classifiers
- 5. Employing role shifting for recounting stories in the first-person using eye gaze and incorporating the appropriate mood and personality
- 6. Using classifier predicates to describe persons and objects and to convey scenes and events
- 7. Using appropriate ASL syntax and linguistics

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate knowledge of social and cultural information necessary for appropriate and successful interaction in conversations with members of the Deaf community by:

- 1. Using attention-getting behaviors, conversation-openers, and turn-taking skills
- 2. Giving appropriate feedback ("visual listening") to convey understanding
- 3. Describing background and cultural information related to ASL Deaf studies and the Deaf community

Competency 5: The student will be able to perform the correct sign name for geographical locations by:

- 1. Cities and states within the United States
- 2. Cities and countries throughout the world
