## CCJ1191 | Human Behavior in Criminal Justice | 3.00 credits

Human behavior and how it relates to the duties and responsibilities of the criminal justice practitioner.

## **Course Competencies**

**Competency 1:** The student will analyze human behavior theories and their implications for criminal justice practices by:

- 1. Evaluating various psychological theories related to criminal behavior
- 2. Comparing and contrasting behavioral responses in different criminal justice scenarios
- 3. Investigating case studies that illustrate the application of human behavior in law enforcement

Competency 2: The student will evaluate the impact of societal influences on criminal behavior by:

- 1. Assessing the role of socioeconomic factors in shaping criminal activities
- 2. Examining cultural attitudes toward crime and their effects on criminal justice responses
- 3. Investigating the influence of peer groups and community dynamics on individual behavior

Competency 3: The student will apply knowledge of human behavior to enhance criminal justice practices by:

- 1. Developing intervention strategies aimed at reducing recidivism based on behavioral insights
- 2. Formulating communication techniques that foster positive interactions between practitioners and communities
- 3. Implementing conflict resolution practices rooted in understanding human motivations and behaviors

**Competency 4:** The student will explore the ethical responsibilities of criminal justice practitioners in relation to human behavior by:

- 1. Analyzing ethical dilemmas that arise from the assessment of behavioral patterns in individuals
- 2. Discussing the implications of bias and discrimination in the criminal justice system
- 3. Proposing solutions to ethical issues related to the treatment of offenders and victims based on behavioral understanding
