

Course Description

CCJ2358 | Criminal Justice Reporting | 3.00 credits

This course prepares students through instruction and practice to properly prepare written reports common to the criminal justice community. Students will learn a variety of criminal justice scenarios presented and students will be instructed as to proper report format and presentation. Prerequisite: ENC1101.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate proficiency in writing criminal justice reports by:

- 1. Analyzing various report formats used within the criminal justice community
- 2. Practicing the organization of information to create clear and concise narratives
- 3. Evaluating the importance of accuracy and detail in report writing

Competency 2: The student will apply knowledge of criminal justice scenarios to enhance report writing skills by:

- 1. Constructing reports based on hypothetical scenarios to showcase understanding of context
- 2. Identifying key elements and facts that must be included in incident reports
- 3. Synthesizing information from multiple sources to create comprehensive reports

Competency 3: The student will analyze the components of effective report presentation by:

- 1. Reviewing best practices for formatting and structuring written reports
- 2. Evaluating the use of language and tone appropriate for criminal justice documentation
- 3. Comparing various presentation techniques to communicate findings effectively

Competency 4: The student will engage in peer review processes to improve report writing by:

- 1. Providing constructive feedback on classmates' reports to enhance clarity and effectiveness
- 2. Revising written work based on peer suggestions to refine writing skills
- 3. Collaborating with peers to discuss challenges and strategies in report preparation
