

Course Description:

CCJ4660 | Crime, Violence, and Schools | 3.00 Credits

An examination of comprehensive and proven theoretical models of explaining, predicting, and preventing school- based violence.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will apply the techniques used to exercise control during the escalation of a confrontation by:

- 1. Defining violence in schools
- 2. Recognizing signs of escalating behavior
- 3. Reviewing and practicing objectification strategies
- 4. Describing third-party facilitation
- 5. Describing the mediation process

Competency 2: The student will analyze the common traits of violent students and related research on aggression and violence by:

- 1. Exploring community concerns related to school violence
- 2. Identifying and defining common traits among violent students
- 3. Reviewing the historical and recent literature on aggression and violence
- 4. Defining and describing generalizations about violence

Competency 3: The student will examine and define school sociology by:

- 1. Defining cultural violence
- 2. Comparing and contrasting various school cultures
- 3. Delineating the need for an open dialogue in schools
- 4. Relating cultural exclusion to incidents of violence

Competency 4: The student will evaluate strategies to predict and prevent school violence by:

- 1. Describing the theories on predicting school- based violence
- 2. Comparing and contrasting models of interaction
- 3. Applying models that promote an open dialogue with violent students
- 4. Identifying signs of violent students

Competency 5: The student will analyze the data on the relationship between school-based violence and students who use alcohol and drugs by:

- 1. Reviewing data on juvenile drug use
- 2. Discussing the causes of juvenile alcohol use.
- 3. Comparing the relationship between drugs and school crime
- 4. Addressing the cultural impact of juvenile alcohol/drug use

Competency 6: The student will review the relationship and characteristics of school-based crime and violence by:

- 1. Discussing the history of shootings and fatalities in schools
- 2. Comparing school violence to violence in the community
- 3. Researching the dynamics of school crime
- 4. Identifying common factors within violent schools

Competency 7: The student will review policies and procedures within schools by:

1. Analyzing the U.S. Constitution and the Fourth Amendment

- 2. Research case law that supports searches on school grounds
- 3. Differentiating the standards of reasonable suspicion and probable cause
- 4. Listing and describing alternatives to search and seizure
- 5. Learning the types of crimes commonly committed on school grounds
- 6. Discussing and describing Florida law on assault and battery
- 7. Citing Florida's "use of force" law
- 8. Discussing and describing the culture of bullying
- 9. Identifying date rape as a severe violent crime affecting students

Course Competency 8: The student will develop an action plan for school safety by:

- 1. Discussing techniques to avoid power struggles and related gang activity
- 2. Reviewing the process for de-escalating violence
- 3. Analyzing components of an emergency response plan
- 4. Developing a behavior response plan

Course Competency 9: The student will demonstrate knowledge of a school's emergency plan by:

- 1. Defining action for students, teachers, law enforcement, parents, and school personnel
- 2. Identifying patterns of aggression
