

Course Description

CJC4163 | Advanced Probation & Parole | 3.00 credits

A study of the process in which a convicted person can be released into society by means of probation or parole.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will discuss the history of probation and role by:

- 1. tracing the historical development of probation and parole
- 2. comparing and contrasting the goals of probation and parole to community-based programs
- 3. describing future trends in probation and parole, and community-based programs

Competency 2: The student will explore the impact of Federal Crime Control legislation on probation, parole, and community- based programs by:

- 1. Examining and discussing the Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994
- 2. Examining and discussing the Contract with America Crime Bill
- 3. Examining and discussing the Truth in Sentencing laws

Competency 3: The student will examine the impact recent legislation has had on probation, parole and community programs by:

- 1. Discussing overcrowding issues
- 2. Reviewing high rates of incarceration and construction costs
- 3. Analyzing budgetary and fiscal implications
- 4. Analyzing staffing patterns

Competency 4: The student will analyze the effectiveness of probation, parole, and community based programs by:

- 1. Examining criminal justice journals for program models
- 2. Examining the Uniform Crime Report (URC)
- 3. Reviewing surveys and studies assessing community attitudes and acceptance
- 4. Examining the rate of recidivism

Competency 5: The student will discuss the role of Parole Boards by:

- 1. Tracing the emergence of parole boards
- 2. Describing and tracking changes in the power of parole boards
- 3. Describing the selection and appointment of parole board members
- 4. Examining the future of parole boards

Competency 6: The student will review community-based programs for juvenile offenders by:

- 1. Discussing the philosophy of juvenile aftercare
- 2. Comparing and contrasting foster care homes to group homes
- 3. Discussing the concept of treatment versus control
- 4. Comparing and contrasting the advantages and disadvantages of the concept of "deinstitutionalization"

Competency 7: The student will discuss the requisites of the parole officer by:

- 1. Defining duties and responsibilities of a parole officer
- 2. Researching salaries and educational requirements of a parole officer
- 3. Exploring potential situations of the parole officer.

Competency 8: The student will analyze the concept of community justice by:

1. Identifying successful community justice initiatives

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- 2. Discussing the role citizens play in community justice
- 3. Describing the essential elements of community justice

Competency 9: The student will discuss the role of local law enforcement by:

- 1. Defining police responsibilities with respect to probation and parole and assessing what a violation is
- 2. Identifying cooperation needed from local law enforcement

Competency 10: The student will analyze the court system by:

- 1. Discussing the role of the prosecution
- 2. Reviewing the role of a judge
- 3. Determining the defendant's rights
- 4. Citing major determining factors in the jury selection
