

## **Course Description**

## CJC4310 | Correctional Theory | 3.00 credits

An analysis of corrections relative to punishment and rehabilitation strategies utilized at penal institutions throughout the United States.

## Course Competencies:

- 2. Outlining the merits of the AA and NA programs
- 3. Debating the negative impact on the offender when programs are not available

**Competency 4:** The student will discuss the philosophy of halfway houses and how they interrelate to the corrections system by:

- 1. Defining and describing the philosophy and concept of the halfway house
- 2. Analyzing the consequences of failure to meet the criteria of the halfway house
- 3. Describing the impact of program failure on the offender and the penal system

**Competency 5:** The student will describe temporary release programs by:

- 1. Defining the temporary release program
- 2. Discussing and identifying the benefits and negative aspects of the program
- 3. Exploring the societal benefits of the program

**Competency 6**: The student will discuss the use of diversion programs by:

- 1. Defining diversionary programs
- 2. Analyzing the application of diversionary programs by the court system
- 3. Identifying the benefits and failures of diversionary programs

**Competency 7:** The student will discuss the use and rationale for progressive discipline of inmates by:

- 1. Defining progressive discipline
- 2. Outlining the progressive discipline process in corrections
- 3. Describing the goals of progressive discipline

**Competency** 8: The student will discuss the work furlough program and its benefits to the inmate by:

- 1. Defining the work furlough program
- 2. Tracing the benefits of the work furlough program to the inmate
- 3. Describing the benefits to the correctional system and society

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**Competency 9:** The student will discuss the probation program and its benefits by:

- 1. Defining the probation program
- 2. Tracing the advantages of probation
- 3. program to the inmate
- 4. Describing the ramifications of the program to the inmate's family

- 1. Describing the history of the prison system
- 2. Analyzing the changes in the philosophy of corrections
- 3. Outlining the correctional system in the United States
- 4. Debating the advantages and disadvantages of the American penal system
