

Course Description

CJK0063 | Fundamentals of Patrol | 1.33 credits

The student will learn law enforcement techniques and tactics that you will use while on patrol. The student will also learn how to respond to non-criminal calls and conduct structure and area searches, and provides resources that officers use while on patrol. For School of Justice students only.

Course Competency:

Competency 1: The student will learn about patrolling by:

- 1. Practicing the appropriate principles to create community partnerships and become familiar with an assigned patrol area
- 2. Demonstrating the use of senses, training, and mental and physical fitness to preserve public and officer safety when serving the community
- 3. Demonstrating professional use of mobile communication devices when on duty
- 4. Discussing the use of criminal justice information systems, including FCIC (Florida crime information center) and NCIC (National Crime Information Center), while performing law enforcement duties

Competency 2: The student will learn duties while on patrol by:

- Demonstrating how to safely respond and approach the scene, gather initial information, and respond to a BOLO
- 2. Identifying the importance of safely
- 3. Approaching and interacting with a suspect using contact and cover officers
- 4. Demonstrating responding to a call as the backup officer while maintaining officer safety
- 5. Defining the role of behavioral threat assessment and management (BTAM) in identifying and preventing acts of targeted violence

Competency 3: The student will be able to respond to non-criminal calls for service by:

- 1. Identifying the appropriate resources to safely resolve non-criminal calls for service
- 2. Discussing the importance of delivering a death notification to the next of kin in a professional manner.
- 3. Demonstrating to safely check on the well-being of a person and the security of a residence, a building, or grounds
- 4. Discussing how to safely respond to situations involving animal complaints
- 5. Identifying the appropriate course of action when responding to a fire-related incident
- 6. Identifying how to respond to an incident involving lost, stolen, or recovered property
- 7. Discussing how to respond to disputes involving property boundaries, landlords and tenants, motor vehicle repairs, and repossessions
- 8. Identifying how to safely mediate a civil disturbance and maintain the peace during a civil standby
- 9. Demonstrating how to safely control a crowd, demonstration, or riot using effective communication and observation skills

Competency 4: The student will learn structure and area searches by:

- 1. Analyzing how to conduct a legal and tactically sound building search in response to an alarm or call for service
- 2. Demonstrating how to maintain a perimeter when conducting a ground search for a suspect and how to safely pursue a suspect on foot

Competency 5: The student will learn arrest procedures by:

- 1. Demonstrating a safe and lawful arrest
- 2. Identifying the transport of an arrestee to a secure facility
- 3. Discussing the safe transfer of a juvenile or adult arrestee to a secure facility for processing
