

Course Description

CJK0132 | Basic Security Guard Training | 1.40 credits

This course is designed to prepare students to apply for Class "D" Private Security Officer license. Students will learn regulatory compliance, emergency procedures, ethics and entrepreneurship, courtroom procedures, traffic direction and crowd control, and more.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will discuss regulatory compliance by:

- 1. Discussing legislative intent Florida State Statue Chapter 493.6100
- 2. Examining Chapter 493 of Florida State Statue
- 3. Examining 5N-1, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.)
- 4. Reviewing an officer's role in court and courtroom procedures

Competency 2: The student will learn how officer ethics and conduct apply to a security officer by:

- 1. Understanding the role of a private security officer
- 2. Identifying ethical standards that must be practiced as a private security officer
- 3. Identifying principles of communication that will be used in a relationship with the community

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate an officer's duties by:

- 1. Identifying how security officers conduct affects the officer and his community
- 2. Demonstrating proper observation and incident reporting
- 3. Demonstrating proper patrol techniques
- 4. Identifying key principles of safeguarding information
- 5. Defining physical security and identifying its key components
- 6. Defining safety awareness and identifying its key components
- 7. Discussing emergency preparedness and medical emergencies
- 8. Identifying proper interviewing techniques
- 9. Discussing terrorism, event security and special assignments
- 10. Defining communication systems commonly used by officers
- 11. Identifying special issues intro to security officers' weapons

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Demonstrate knowledge of ethical thinking and its application to issues in society
