

Course Description

DAA1201 | Intermediate Ballet Dance | 2.00 - 3.00 credits

The continued development of various aspects of ballet technique terminology. Prerequisite: DAA1200 or permission of the department. May be repeated for credit.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will execute secondary ballet steps correctly using proper body alignment, turnout, and weight distribution on the feet by:

- 1. Demonstrating an appreciation for aesthetics and creative activities
- 2. Describing how natural systems function and recognize the impact of humans on the environment

Competency 2: The student will understand the ballet vocabulary, using it correctly when referring to a movement, position, or concept by:

- 1. Formulating strategies to locate, evaluate, and apply information
- 2. Demonstrating an appreciation for aesthetics and creative activities

Competency 3: The student will respond to verbal commands, defining movements, positions, or concepts, spelling them correctly, and demonstrating them in action by:

- 1. Solving problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- 2. Formulating strategies to locate, evaluate, and apply information

Competency 4: The student will understand the way in which correct body alignment correlates with ballet movement by:

- 1. Demonstrating an appreciation for aesthetics and creative activities
- 2. Describing how natural systems function and recognize the impact of humans on the environment

Competency 5: The student will understand how to put together steps to form intermediate-level combinations that are performed with more complex musical counts by:

- 1. Solving problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
