

Course Description

EAP0360 | Grammar Level 3 | 3.00 credits

Students develop the ability to use intermediate-level grammatical structure appropriate to classroom discussion and the writing of academic paragraphs with an emphasis on increased accuracy. Prerequisite: EAP 0260.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate proficiency by:

1. Incorporating the grammatical structures from Levels 1-2 (See competencies for these levels)

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate understanding of sentence structure, conjunctions & clauses by:

- 1. Using simple and complex sentences
- 2. Using complex sentences with high frequency subordinating conjunctions
- 3. Using basic conjunctions in adverb clauses of time, contrast, and cause and effect (e.g., when, while, because, although)
- 4. Using questions

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate understanding of parts of speech and phrases by:

- 1. Using articles and noun phrases
- 2. Using forms of other (e.g., another, others, etc.)
- 3. Using possessive noun phrases
- 4. Using direct and indirect object pronouns
- 5. Using reflexive and reciprocal pronouns

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate understanding of verbs (tense, aspect, voice, and mood) by:

- 1. Using the present, past, or future tenses in the active voice in affirmative, negative and question forms as indicated by the context of a passage or conversation
- 2. Using the past progressive as contrasted by the simple past

Competency 5: The student will demonstrate understanding of high frequency modals and related phrasal forms by:

- 1. Recognizing them in contextualized meaning
- 2. Using the affirmative, negative, and question forms for present and future intention such as could/would, may/might, must, should/could, used to
