

Course Description

EAP0460 | Grammar Level 4 | 3.00 credits

Students develop the ability to use intermediate-level grammatical structure appropriate to classroom discussion, oral presentation, and the writing of more sophisticated academic paragraphs with an emphasis on increased accuracy. Prerequisite: EAP 0360.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate proficiency by:

1. Incorporating the grammatical structures from Levels 1-3 (see competencies for these levels)

Competency 2: The student will produce written English by:

- 1. Using a variety of sentence structure patterns (including questions) appropriate to the level and containing forms covered in this and previous levels
- 2. Using either/neither/so/too
- 3. Forming restrictive and non-restrictive adjective clauses with relative pronouns (who, whom, which, that, whose)

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate an understanding of parts of speech and phrases by:

- 1. Using gerunds and infinitives after verbs
- 2. Using past participles
- 3. Using comparative, superlative, and equative phrases
- 4. Using intensifiers (e.g., very, too, etc.)

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate understanding of verb tense by:

1. Using the present perfect and present perfect progressive in affirmative, negative, and question forms as indicated by the context of a passage or conversation
