

Course Description

EAP1560 | Grammar Level 5 | 3.00 credits

Students develop the ability to use complex grammatical structures appropriate for academic presentations, discussions, and essays at this level. Prerequisite: EAP0460.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate proficiency by:

1. Incorporating the grammatical structures from Levels 1-4 (See competencies for these levels)

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate understanding of sentence structure, conjunctions, and clauses by:

- 1. Using a variety of sentence structure patterns, including questions appropriate to the level and containing grammatical forms covered in this and prior levels
- 2. Reducing adjective clauses to phrases
- 3. Using subordinate conjunctions
- 4. Reducing adverb clauses to phrases
- 5. Using clauses linked by conjunctive adverbs, for example, however, thus, nevertheless

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate understanding of verb tense, aspect, voice, and mood by:

- 1. Applying active and passive voice verbs in affirmative, negative, and question forms as indicated by the context of a passage
- 2. Sequencing verbs in multiple clause sentences
- 3. Distinguishing between perfect and perfect progressive forms and their uses

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate understanding and application of modals and related phrasal forms by:

- 1. Recognizing them in contextualized meaning
- 2. using them in affirmative, negative, and question forms: had to (past necessity) and could (past ability)
