

Course Description

EAP1581 | Advanced 1 Combined Skills: Content-based English | 6.00 credits

This course is intended for Advanced I EAP students and prepares the non-native speaker of English for college level study. Students will learn by focusing on speaking, listening, grammar/vocabulary, writing, and reading comprehension skills as they relate to selected Education courses. Prerequisites: EAP 0400, 0420, 0440, and 0460. Corequisite: EEC 1000, or EEC 1200, or EEC 1311, or EEC 2202. Recommended preparation: Appropriate passing score on the COMPASS Test.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will develop level proficiency in grammar and vocabulary for academic purposes by:

- 1. Understanding and formulating phrases, clauses, sentences, and questions in frequently used tenses, aspects, and active or passive voice according to context
- 2. Using diverse structures appropriate for effective academic presentations, discussions, and essays

Competency 2: The student will develop level proficiency in speaking/listening to English in academic settings by:

- 1. Discussing lectures, participating in discussions and small group activities, and giving presentations on given topics
- 2. Implementing basic note-taking strategies and recognizing signposting in lectures
- 3. Interpreting and clarifying information discussed in class lectures
- 4. Recognizing and using content vocabulary and common level-appropriate idioms and cultural references

Competency 3: The student will develop level proficiency in reading English for academic purposes by:

- 1. Comprehending and extrapolating information from general education texts in order to give informed opinions and observations
- 2. Identifying an author's purposes, presentation of theories, processes, definitions, supporting details, and/or points of view
- 3. Creating appropriate reading strategies according to text
- 4. Identifying rhetorical patterns and shifts in text types and examining meaning of connection elements

Competency 4: The student will develop level proficiency in writing English for academic purposes by:

- 1. Creating paragraphs, essays, and other academic writing tasks that exhibit content knowledge and elaboration
- 2. Quoting, paraphrasing, defining, and summarizing at an appropriate level

Competency 5: The student will develop level proficiency in intellectual and practical skills by:

- 1. Demonstrating critical and creative thinking
- 2. Demonstrating intercultural knowledge and competence
- 3. Illustrating ethical reasoning
