

Course Description

EAP1660 | Grammar Level 6 | 3.00 credits

Students develop the ability to use complex grammatical structures appropriate for effective academic presentations, discussions, and essays at this level. Prerequisite: EAP1560.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate proficiency by:

1. Using the grammatical structures from Levels 1-5

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate understanding of sentence structure, conjunctions, and clauses by:

- 1. Using a variety of sentence structure patterns, including questions, containing grammatical forms covered in this and previous levels
- 2. Using noun clauses as subjects or objects, including embedded speech and reported speech
- 3. Using clauses linked by correlative conjunctions (both...and..., either...or..., neither...nor...)

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate understanding of different structures and phrases by:

- 1. Using real and unreal conditionals
- 2. Using causative forms
- 3. Using subjunctive forms

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate understanding of verb tense, aspect, voice, and mood by:

- 1. Using active and passive voice verbs in affirmative, negative, and question forms as indicated by the context of a passage or conversation
- 2. Using a variety of verb tenses and forms of inflection

Competency 5: The student will demonstrate understanding of perfect modals and related phrasal forms, including but not limited to could have, would have, may/might have, should have, and will have by:

1. Using them in contextualized meaning in their affirmative, negative, and question forms
