

Course Description

EDG2943 | Educational Service Field Work | 1.00 - 3.00 credits

The student will learn to compile the necessary documents and complete the process of obtaining a state and/or national early childhood credential. The student must complete the four courses in either the Infant/Toddler Specialization or the Preschool Specialization in order to take this course. Prerequisite: EEC1311, EEC1200, EEC1000, EEC2202, EEC1001, EEC1522, EEC2201, EEC2407.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will compile the requisite portfolio by:

- 1. Reading and completing the program contract
- 2. Writing an autobiography/summary of education that includes professional work and educational attainment
- 3. Writing Statements of Competency that indicate how the student is able to meet the needs of young children in the competency area
- 4. Collecting and compiling Resource Collections

Competency 2: The student will document the number of hours instructed by:

- 1. Analyzing the training requirements completed in each prerequisite course
- 2. Utilizing the Tracking Tool that documents the number of hours completed either by employment or volunteer work at an approved child care center

Competency 3: The student will prepare for a classroom observation by:

- 1. Reviewing the 15 Functional Areas to be assessed
- 2. Analyzing the requirements of the Assessment Tool
- 3. Demonstrating compliance with the requirements of the Assessment Tool

Learning Outcomes:

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Formulate strategies to locate, evaluate, and apply information
