

Course Description

EEX2776 | The Challenged Citizen in the Workplace | 3.00 credits

This course is designed to provide the necessary skills and attitudes to comprehend, analyze, apply, discuss, and incorporate effective practice principles when working in a diverse workforce that includes people with mental and physical challenges. This course emphasizes the perspectives, challenges, and processes regarding making the workplace more inclusive for all employees across a wide variety of professional disciplines.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate the ability to understand and engage with diversity in the workplace by:

- 1. Identifying effective communication strategies for interacting with individuals of varying abilities
- 2. Analyzing workplace scenarios to recognize barriers to inclusion
- 3. Discussing best practices for supporting colleagues with mental and physical challenges

Competency 2: The student will apply inclusive practices within a diverse workforce by:

- 1. Implementing strategies to accommodate the needs of employees with disabilities
- 2. Collaborating with team members to promote a culture of inclusivity
- 3. Evaluating organizational policies for their effectiveness in supporting diversity

Competency 3: The student will advocate for an inclusive workplace environment by:

- 1. Developing training materials that raise awareness about diversity and inclusion
- 2. Communicating the importance of inclusive practices to stakeholders
- 3. Proposing initiatives that foster a supportive and accessible work culture for all employees
