

Course Description

EMS2659 | EMS-Field Internship and Conference | 8.00 credits

A supervised clinical experience on an advanced life Support (ALS) vehicle. The student obtains increasing patient care responsibilities as a working member of the EMS team under the direct supervision of a designated preceptor. Prerequisites: EMS 2601, 2601, 2602, 2602L, 2664, 2665.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will be able to integrate pathophysiological principles of pharmacology and the assessment findings to formulate a field impression and implement a pharmacologic management plan by:

- 1. Differentiating between the chemical, generic (nonproprietary), and trade (proprietary) names of a drug
- 2. Demonstrating clean techniques during medication administration
- 3. Demonstrating the ability to gather patient history information and assessment findings to form a field impression

Competency 2: The student will able to establish and/or maintain a patent airway, oxygenate, and ventilate a patient by:

- Demonstrating adequate endotracheal, nasotracheal, subglottic, supraglottic, placement of airway devices
- 2. Demonstrating methods of assessment for confirming correct placement of any airway device
- 3. Demonstrating endotracheal intubation, placement confirmation, and securement in the adult, infant, and child patient

- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Demonstrate knowledge of ethical thinking and its application to issues in society
