

Course Description

ENC1113 | Writing Skills Review | 1.00 - 3.00 credits

This course is designed for students whose writing and/or English language skills test scores demonstrate a need for continued instructional support and features self-assessment grammar diagnostics. Students will learn the principles of composition via the writing process: planning, drafting, revising, finishing and editing. Note: This variable credit course is repeatable. Prerequisites: Non-demonstration of readiness through placement testing or alternate methods or ENCO021 with a grade of "S".

Course Competencies

Course competency 1: The student will engage in planning, drafting, and revising by:

- 1. Brainstorming ideas for writing assignments
- 2. Creating outlines to organize thoughts and structure the content
- 3. Revising drafts based on feedback and self-assessment

Course competency 2: The student will practice finishing and editing by:

- 1. Completing writing assignments with attention to detail and coherence
- 2. Reviewing and proofreading for grammar, punctuation, and spelling errors
- 3. Applying self-assessment grammar diagnostics to improve the quality of their writing

Course competency 3: The student will develop self-assessment skills by:

- 1. Reflecting on their writing process and identifying areas for improvement
- 2. Evaluating their own work for clarity, coherence, and effectiveness
- 3. Utilizing self-assessment tools to monitor their progress and growth in English language skills

Learning Outcomes:

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Formulate strategies to locate, evaluate, and apply information
