

Course Description

The curriculum draws from many recognized authorities in exploring the methods and mechanics of imparting information and adult learning principles. The course emphasizes techniques that have wide application in teaching situations, as well as devices for specific training areas. The course also stresses measuring teaching effectiveness, and the use of media and visual aids.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will discuss the federal, state, and local laws that regulate emergency services, national standards influencing emergency services, standard of care, tort, liability, and a review of court cases by:

1. Describing federal, state, and local laws, which regulate or influence emergency services

Competency 2: The student will describe and discuss methods of instruction involved in planning and conducting an effective training program for adult learners by:

1. Defining various roles and characteristics of an instructor
2. Describing the responsibilities of an instructor
3. Explaining how ethics influence students and instruction in a classroom
4. Explaining legal issues faced by instructors
5. Identifying difficult students and how to deal with them
6. Describing types of feedback
7. Discussing the instructor's role in safety in the classroom
8. Describing and discussing the characteristics and motivation of adult learners
9. Identifying concerns when choosing instructors and facilities
