## FIL4164 | Advanced Writing for Film and Television | 3.00 credits

In this upper division course in Film, Television Digital Production students will learn the process of completing a long form motion picture or television script. Prerequisites: RTV2300, FIL2131

## Course Competencies:

**Competency 1:** The student will develop and analyze traditional visual storytelling structures by:

- 1. Analyzing stories in various formats
- 2. Identifying specific characteristics of film and television scripts
- 3. Evaluating the role of ethics in film and television writing
- 4. Critiquing various film and television scripts

**Competency 2:** The student will demonstrate proficiency in the principles of writing for film or television by:

- 1. Analyzing plot structure for film and television scripts
- 2. Developing an outline for a film or television script
- 3. Completing a first draft screenplay or teleplay for long-form entertainment

**Competency 3:** The student will critically assess the components of film and television scripts by:

- 1. Analyzing students' film and television scripts
- 2. Analyzing structural, plot, and character components of scripts
- 3. Critiquing students' scripts through weekly class discussion
