

Course Description

FSE2140 | Embalming 2 | 3.00 credits

This course is a continuation of Embalming I lecture and places emphasis on embalming considerations and procedures for pathogenesis and advanced decomposition. Students will learn to use specialized chemicals, treatment of post-mortem cases and advanced embalming techniques. Corequisite: FSE2140L

Course Competencies:

- 2. Distinguishing each chemical by explaining its use

- 2. Distinguishing pathological symptoms that may affect the embalming procedure

- 2. Describing the procedures for aspirating and hyping the three cavities that need treatment
- 3. Determining the cavity fluid needed to adequately treat the viscera
