

Course Description

HIM1800 | Professional Practice Experience 1 | 2.00 credits

This course will provide the student with a supervised professional practice experience in a healthcare setting, utilizing electronic health records and reports to manage health information data. Students will learn an in-depth knowledge of applying the minimum basic requirements for handling records imposed by regulatory agencies. Prerequisite: HIM 1000; corequisite: HIM1110, 1000L.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate knowledge of health information management functions and the ability to process a health record for completeness and accuracy by:

- 1. Formulating delinquency health record statistics for the medical staff committee
- 2. Creating statistical and display graphical charts for compliance with Joint Commission standards for record completion
- 3. Defining bloodborne pathogens exposure risk for healthcare personnel and handling health records

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate knowledge of ethical and legal practices within the health information management and healthcare environment by:

- 1. Identifying HIPAA privacy and confidentiality rules for work processes
- 2. Conducting and interviewing health care providers for health information needs and preferences
- 3. Demonstrating knowledge of ethical thinking and its application to issues addressed at clinical

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate knowledge of management in the front/ back office by:

1. Identify the services that health records indicate for services according to the needs

Learning Outcomes:

- Use quantitative analytical skills to evaluate and process numerical data
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Demonstrate knowledge of ethical thinking and its application to issues in society
