

Course Description

HIM2820 | Seminar and Professional Practice Experience 3 | 2.00 credits

This course is designed to provide students with structured learning experiences necessary for them to enter the health information management field. Students will learn preparation skills for the national examination by analyzing major examination topics offered in curriculum. A professional practice experience will be a component of this course. Prerequisite: HIM2810; corequisites: HIM2500, 2500L.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate knowledge of communicating skills learned in health information practices by:

- 1. Creating a professional ePortfolio
- 2. Engaging in a professional interview
- 3. Recommending services and equipment for the Health Information Management department

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate knowledge and skill in interpreting data graphs by:

- 1. Creating necessary proofs, diagrams, formulas, cycles, etc.
- 2. Pertaining health information management documents
- 3. Displaying a graphic chart of student's test performance
- 4. Designing an action plan

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate active skills in current issues and problem-solving methods as it apply health information by:

- 1. Describing the problem as it pertains to health information management practices
- 2. Comparing problem-solving tactics and arriving at a satisfactory solution
- 3. Utilizing informational databases to offer alternative solutions

Learning Outcomes:

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Use quantitative analytical skills to evaluate and process numerical data
- Formulate strategies to locate, evaluate, and apply information
