

Course Description

IND1300 | Interior Design Presentations 1 | 2.00 credits

An introductory course in the use of various media for presentation of plans, schemes, and interior perspective renderings. Prerequisite: IND1020; Corequisite: IND1200.

Course Competencies

- 1. Investigating different types of presentation tools and techniques.
- 2. Experimenting with traditional and digital formats for visual representation.
- 3. Analyzing the advantages and limitations of each media type.

- 2. Assessing the clarity and effectiveness of visual elements in conveying design intent.
- 3. Comparing the impact of various media on audience engagement and understanding.

- 1. Utilizing software tools for creating digital renderings and presentations.
- 2. Implementing best practices in layout and composition for effective visual communication.
- 3. Integrating feedback to refine and improve presentation techniques continuously.
