

Course Description

IND2500 | Professional Practices | 3.00 credits

This course explains the duties and responsibilities relative to employment and business practices. Prerequisite: Sophomore standing level or equivalent

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate understanding of employment responsibilities by:

- 1. Analyzing legal and ethical obligations in the workplace
- 2. Evaluating the impact of employment laws on business practices
- 3. Explaining the rights and duties of employers and employees
- 4. Identifying key elements of employment contracts and agreements

Competency 2: The student will apply knowledge of business practices by:

- 1. Assessing the effectiveness of various business models
- 2. Implementing strategies to improve workplace efficiency and productivity
- 3. Developing policies that promote ethical business conduct
- 4. Designing frameworks for effective employee management
- 5. Proposing solutions to common business practice challenges

Competency 3: The student will develop expertise in managing employment relations by:

- 1. Analyzing conflict resolution techniques in the workplace
- 2. Creating plans for employee training and development
- 3. Evaluating the role of human resources in fostering a positive work environment
- 4. Implementing performance evaluation systems
- 5. Designing strategies for employee retention and motivation

Competency 4: The student will synthesize knowledge of employment and business practices through practical applications by:

- 1. Conducting case studies on successful business practices
- 2. Developing comprehensive business plans
- 3. Presenting and defending business strategies in a professional setting
- 4. Critiquing peer business proposals using industry standards
- 5. Creating a portfolio showcasing a range of employment and business practice projects
