## PGY2475 | Advanced Photography | 3.00 - 4.00 Credits

The production of advanced portfolio in black and white or color, while emphasizing photography as a studio area in art. A continuation in the development of both technical and aesthetic concerns for the art student majoring in photography. Prerequisite: PGY2404C
