

#### **Course Description**

### PLA2610 | Introduction to Real Property | 3.00 Credits

This is an introductory course that provides an overview of the general concepts of real property law applied in most states, including substantive legal issues, ownership, terms and various legal forms, the mechanics of various residential, some commercial transactions, and mortgage foreclosures. Prerequisites: REE2040 with a grade of "C" or better; Corequisite: PLA2631C.
