

Course Description

RTV1000 | Fundamentals of Broadcasting | 3.00 credits

In this introductory course for television and radio broadcasting, students will learn about the foundations of the American broadcast system.

Course Competencies

Competency 1: The student will understand the history of television and radio broadcasting by:

- 1. Identifying key events in the development of broadcasting
- 2. Examining how key events shaped modern broadcasting
- 3. Relating the history of broadcasting through written assignments

Competency 2: The student will comprehend basic commercial and noncommercial broadcast operations by:

- 1. Defining key broadcast station positions
- 2. Identifying basic broadcast station functions
- 3. Identifying broadcast distribution methods
- 4. Determining basic programming strategies
- 5. Explaining program ratings and measurement tools
- 6. Relating broadcast operations through assignments

Competency 3: The student will develop an understanding of the impact of broadcasting on global society by:

- 1. Defining First Amendment principles and regulatory issues affecting broadcasting
- 2. Examining broadcast licensing and telecommunications law
- 3. Developing theories and practices that apply to broadcasting
- 4. Developing broadcast theory and practice through written assignments
