An analysis and evaluation of leadership styles best suited for success in the field of security.

Course Competencies:

2. Describing and discussing cost/benefit theory
3. Analyzing case studies

Competency 6: The student will critique a leadership case problem by:

1. Applying leadership concepts
2. Constructing a consultant's report
3. Providing a solution and implementing a process

Competency 7: The student will define global leadership styles by:

1. Comparing and contrasting domestic and international leadership styles
2. Evaluating the emergence of global leadership influences
3. Discussing the impact of diversity on leadership

1. Analyzing the relationship among ethical behavior, law and free choice
2. Debating ethical issues in public safety
3. Recognizing the basis for compliance programs
