THE2051 | Children's Theatre Production | 3.00 credits

The theory of children's theatre, its development with the American theatrical scene, its function within the American community and applications of the theories in actual productions before audiences.

Course Competencies:

- 1. Identifying techniques for the engagement of young audiences.
- 2. Identifying techniques for creating interactive theatrical experiences.
- 3. Applying the techniques to examine audience engagement in children's theatre production.

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate knowledge of ethical considerations by:

- 1. Identifying ethical and moral implications when producing theatre for children.
- 2. Applying these considerations to examining children's theatre production regarding themes, content, and presentation.

- Demonstrate an appreciation for aesthetics and creative activities.
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning.
