

Course Description

TPP1190 | Studio Theatre-Cast | 1.00 Credit

Practical application of skills acquired in acting classes through public presentation of student-produced studio theatre as a member of the cast. May be repeated for credit. Prerequisite: Permission of department chairperson

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate performance technique by:

- 1. Exploring and refining various performance techniques, including voice modulation, physicality, character development, and emotional expression.
- 2. Cultivating the ability to embody diverse characters and conveying compelling narratives on stage.

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate rehearsal and collaboration teamwork by:

- 1. Implementing learned strategies for script analysis, blocking, improvisation, and scene study.
- 2. Fostering a supportive environment where actors, directors, and designers collaborate to bring performances to life.

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate characterization and dramatic interpretation skills by:

- 1. Developing nuanced performances that resonate with authenticity and depth.
- 2. Building deeper characterization and dramatic interpretations based on foundational acting principles.

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate performance critiques and reflection by:

- 1. Engaging in critical analysis of their performances and those of their peers.
- 2. Applying exercises of constructive feedback sessions and guided reflection to develop a discerning eye for theatrical craft and cultivate a reflective practice that fosters continuing growth and improvement as performers.

- 1. Identifying and practicing the ethical and professional responsibilities of theatre practice.
