

Course Description

TPP2191 | Mainstage Production - Cast | 1.00 - 3.00 Credits

Participation in a major theatrical production as a member of the cast. Main stage productions will be presented publicly to the student body and community. May be repeated for credit. Prerequisite: Permission of department chairperson.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate basic knowledge of rehearsal protocols by:

- 1. Defining rehearsal procedures and mechanics.
- 2. Identifying staging procedures and movement patterns.

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate an understanding of the plot and assigned character of the performance material by:

- 1. Relating events in the story to similar real-world events (i.e., personal experiences, historical and current events, either real or imagined).
- 2. Analyzing the language and speech patterns of the character.
- 3. Identifying the extraordinary dramatic world of the piece.

Competency 3: The student will execute the assigned role in production by:

- 1. Projecting one's self believably into words and action into the imaginary circumstances of the performance material.
- 2. Creating character convincingly in an ensemble relationship with other actors.
- 3. Using the voice effectively as an instrument for characterization to project and deliver assigned text.

Competency 4: The student will display analytical and critical thinking skills by:

- 1. Reading and analyzing the material to be performed.
- 2. Evaluating individual and collaborative efforts in the presentation of the performance material

Learning Outcome

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills.
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning.
- Demonstrate an appreciation for aesthetics and creative activities.
