Two Paths For Two Top MDC Graduates

By Charlie Hudson Jazmin Laughlin might never purchase clothes and accessories from Lisbet Hernandez and Lisbet probably won't ever see Jazmin in a medical setting. Their time in high school and Miami-Dade College Homestead Campus do share common traits though.

Laughlin, who often preferred doctor outfits for her dolls, learned early on that good health can't be taken for granted. She was born with Factor VII Deficiency, a rare bleeding disorder, and common scraps or bruising always carry an element of risk for her.

She learned to adapt and the opportunity to enter medical training at Homestead Senior High School combined with her willingness to embrace extra work set her firmly on the path she intends to follow to a career as an anesthesiologist.

She graduated from high school with her simultaneous diploma,

Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) certification, and college credit in two other courses. She strongly urges high school students to recognize the value of these programs.

"Take as many AP or college classes as you can," she said. "Look up different scholarships and understand the deadlines even if it is for later."

According to MDC, Laughlin "chose MDC to continue her educational journey because she wanted to stay close to home and because of all the opportunities that opened up to her including doing HIV research under the guidance of Dr. Nia Madison, Director of HIV Research/and Assistant Professor of Microbiology at Homestead Campus, and spreading awareness about blood disorders, mental health, and breast cancer."

MDC continued, "While being a full-time student Laughlin also worked part-time as a school nurse at MAST Academy and Homestead Middle School. Her school accolades include the Adult Learning Scholarship by The Southeastern Association of Educational Opportunity Program Personnel (SAE-OPP) and the Take Stock in Children Scholarship."

Among her extracurricular contributions, she served as Student Goverament Association

President and TRIO FL Collegiate President on the Miami Dade College-Homestead Campus.

Family and friends were with her Saturday, April 23, 2022 to celebrate her graduation from MDC-Homestead. She is taking four more summer classes at MDC before going on to Florida International University (FIU) in the fall as a Biology Major on the Pre-Med Track.

"I will expand my horizons to whichever is best," she said looking beyond her undergraduate studies.

Lisbet Hernandez, who attended Homestead Senior High School, also recommends taking advantage of specialized and Magnet Programs. In her case, Hospitality & Tourism wasn't necessarily going to help fulfill her plans to study Forensics and aspire to joining the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

She enjoyed the program though and she was acquiring business and marketing skills. Fashion was another interest and when she set up and began to post on her Instagram account, she didn't anticipate offers coming in for her to model and endorse certain brands and merchandise.

With pandemic restrictions of 2019 and 2020 impacting classes, she wanted something more on the side and an entrepreneurial spark was lit.

As she explained, "On May 28, 2020 I took the risk to start an online women's boutique in the middle of the pandemic." Her modeling and contacts with suppliers provided resources she needed for a successful start.

"This is when I decided to major in Business Administration at MDC. I had the basic experience, I had an online business, and I wanted to continue learning new skills."

"When Business Administration major Lisbet Hernandez, 19, graduates from MDC and goes on to Florida International University to pursue a Bachelor's and a Master's degree, she will become the first member of her family to go so far in higher education. Hernandez is the daughter of Mexican migrant workers who only attended school until the 5th grade and years ago crossed the U.S. -Mexico border to give

their family a chance at the American Dream. She was born in Miami and raised in Homestead, where she grew up with the farmworker experience close to her heart. At MDC she was part of the College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) as a participant, employee, and volunteer."

Hernandez's graduation Saturday, April 23, 2022, added an Associate in Business Administration to the Business Specialist, General Business Certificate she earned the previous year.

In thinking of students in high school, she draws from her experience.

"Advice I have for students in their junior year of high school would be to make meaningful connections with your teachers for future recommendation letters. Make sure to get excellent grades and always take a business class no matter what career you want to major in. Also pass all your classes and take as many dual enrollment classes as you can because those will definitely help you out in college and you can be able to finish quicker as those are college credits and count."

She will continue to run her own boutique while at FIU. Although her clientele is predominantly on the West Coast because her products are manufactured in the Los Angeles area, she is working to build a local regional base.

Charles Press being inducted into Law Enforcement Hall of Fame

Bad boys never stood much of a chance against Charles Press.

The former Key Biscayne Police Chief and his fellow officers in Miami Beach made thousands of arrests over the course of his 46-year law enforcement career in South Florida – protecting the public from the devious "Cocaine Cowboys," corralling desperate Cuban refugees from the Mariel Boatlift, and weathering a string of five Miami-area riots, notably in Overtown and Liberty City.

Through all the years of handcuffs, sirens and arrests, one culprit remained elusive: the dreaded green iguana.

It was during his 17-year stint on Key Biscayne that Press once was tasked as the interim leader in the Public Works department.

"We were trying to rid the Village of the iguana problem we were having at that time, so now I suddenly became the Chief Iguana Hunter," Press said, laughing. "I never figured in my career I'd be chasing down iguanas, so it became quite a joke among us. We did get a lot of them, but there's a lot more out there."

For all of his efforts -- including, perhaps, his iguana chasing days -- Press will be among the five latest inductees into the Florida Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of Fame in Tallahassee.

His plaque will be placed in the Florida Capitol Building during a May 21 ceremony.

"It's quite an honor," said Press, 67, relaxing at home and taking a day off from his "honey-do" list. "When you think of it, of all the thousands and thousands of those who have committed their life to this profession, and it's not only that they do it by nomination (from five major organizations), but they only take five (people). That's pretty small company, and pretty unique.

"It's the most humbling honor I've ever received."

The Hall of Fame was created in October of 2014 to allow the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to "honor law enforcement officers who put their lives on the line for the safety and protection of Florida's citizens and visitors through their works, service and exemplary accomplishments." The tribute not only honors "their unselfish dedication as daily heroes" but those who contribute to the advancement of the law enforcement field, as well.

"This is an honor I alone didn't earn," said Press, who also is enshrined in the Miami-Dade College Hall of Fame. "You've got to have a team of people to help you succeed, like a good football team or a good corporate team. It's great to be identified for what I've done, but it also reflects the tremendous work that was done at the Key Biscayne and Miami Beach police departments."

The inductions began in 2016 and only 30 previous law enforcement officers have been selected. In perspective, there are nearly 50,000 current sworn officers in Florida, including some 7,000 just within the City of Miami and Miami-Dade police departments alone.

One of the 2018 inductees was Fred Maas, who was in Press' police academy class at Miami-Dade College and went on to serve with the Miami-Dade and Sunny Isles police departments. "What are the odds?" Press said.

Tactics changed over the years

During his career, Press changed his approach as a law enforcement officer, going from, say, the rough-and-tough badge-wearing Charles Bronson type to the neighborly "Sheriff Andy" image. That's because he's seen the worst of times and the best of times.

"As a young officer, I came in at the most violent time in Miami history ... the 1980 Mariel Boatlifts, the (drug-trafficking) "Cocaine Cowboys," five major racial riots ... the violence was extreme," Press said."Two of my friends (fellow officers) were murdered by criminals. Several survived shootings. In order to survive, I had to have that very strong warrior mentality back then.

"As life in South Florida changed, and as I grew as a person and a leader in different roles, I saw more of the humanitarian side of what a police officer should be doing. So I went from a warrior to (what Key Biscayne residents saw for 17 years). It has been unique, very interesting."

Press, a graduate of Barry University in Miami Shores, served a year as president of the Miami-Dade County Association of Chiefs of Police and spent more than 29 years as the Assistant Chief of Police for the Miami Beach Police Department, where in 1983 he was named Officer of the Year. In 2008, he was inducted into the Miami-Dade College Hall of Fame.

On Key Biscayne, he helped the Village become perennially ranked among Florida's "Safest Cities" lists, even becoming nationally recognized for its low, or zero, crimes in an area of its size. Statistics a year ago showed Key Biscayne ranked 73.21% below the average state total crime rate and 72.19% below the average national total crime rate.

His police department achieved Excelsior Status, landing it in the top 1% of accredited departments that have maintained the highest standards and best practices, and he also introduced body cameras for complete transparency.

Life on the "island paradise" made it a pleasure for Press and his officers to become a "friendly face" when it came to enforcement.

"Back in Miami Beach, we put thousands of legitimate criminals in jail, but it was totally different then, a most intense narcotics time. Now, it's a completely different wave," Press said.


"One thing I came to realize is saving people's lives is a feeling you never forget, and I'd rather do that than put someone in jail. But putting in jail a really horrible person -- that's a good thing."

In case you're wondering, Press still carries a badge.

"It says 'Retired' on it," he said, laughing.

Leyla McCalla Shares New Single 'Le Bal est Fini'

McCalla has tour dates listed through July.

New Orleans multi-instrumentalist Leyla McCalla has shared the track "Le Bal est Fini" today via the Sourthern culture magazine Garden & Gun. Featured on her new album 'Breaking The Thermometer' which comes out this Friday, "Le Bal est Fini" is French for "The party is over".

"Jean Dominique, station owner and director of Radio Haiti, exclaimed in his editorial broadcast in 1980: 'Bon Appetite

Messieurs, le bal est fini' or "the party is over"," McCalla said as she explained the significance of the phrase. "In 1980, Radio Haiti was shut down and all of its journalists were either executed, jailed or exiled alongside many of Haiti's most prominent artists, intellectuals and academics. I took some of the initial words from this editorial to write this song, a repudiation of the political repression that all news media were subjected to."

Born out of a multi-disciplinary theater project commissioned by Duke University, which acquired the complete Radio Haiti archives in 2016, 'Breaking The Thermometer' combines original compositions and traditional Haitian tunes with historical broadcasts and contemporary interviews to forge an immersive sonic journey through a half century of racial, social, and political unrest.

The music is captivating, fueled by rich, sophisticated melodic work and intoxicating Afro-Caribbean rhythms, and the juxtaposition of voices-English and Kreyòl, personal and political, anecdotal and journalistic-is similarly entrancing, raising the dead as it shines a light on the enduring spirit of the Haitian people. McCalla isn't just some detached observer here, though; she writes with great insight and introspection, examining her own journey of growth and self-discovery as she uncovers the Radio Haiti story and the inextricable ties that bind us all to it.

"Haiti's always seen as this far-away place," she says, "but we're far more connected as Americans than we realize. Haiti was the first independent Black nation in the western hemisphere. Its very existence was and remains a threat to colonial power. At the same time, though, it symbolizes a lot about injustice and oppression around the world. When we talk about 'Black Lives Matter,' Haiti is a huge part of that."

On its surface, the record explores the legacy of Radio Haiti and the journalists who risked and lost their lives to broadcast it for nearly 50 years. But on a more fundamental level, the collection is a deeply personal reckoning with memory and identity, with the roles of artists and activists and immigrants in modern society, with the very notion of storytelling itself.

In delving into the project, McCalla found herself forced to grapple with her own experiences as a Haitian-American woman, unraveling layers of marginalization and generations of repression and resolve as she searched for a clearer vision of herself and her purpose. The result is at once a work of radical performance art, historical scholarship, and personal memoir, a wide-ranging and powerful meditation on family and democracy and free expression that couldn't have arrived at a more timely moment.

"The more I researched this project, the more I found myself examining my own sense of Haitianness," McCalla reflects. "I spent a lot of time recalling my experiences visiting Haiti as a child, thinking deeply about the moments in my life when I felt very Haitian and the moments when I didn't. In the end, the music and the stories here all brought me to a more nuanced understanding of both the country and myself."

The 'Breaking The Thermometer' theatre work will be shown at Miami Dade College this Friday on album release day and in June Leyla will embark on a run of West coast tour dates with Neko Case. All upcoming shows are listed below.

MIAMI, May 4, 2022 – Little Havana Social Club at Miami Dade College's (MDC) Koubek Center Presents Colombian percussionist, composer, singer, producer and arranger Humberto Ibarra y su Cumbia Mayor; the Colombian dance group from the Organización Cultural y Folclórica Puerta de Oro; and Los Pascual, a Dominican group, exponents of traditional merengue and bachata led by brothers Reylin and Oniver Pascual, with Venezuelan producer Mr. Pauer as DJ and emcee. Little Havana Social Club, a signature program of the Koubek Center, evokes the sounds and spirit of the *fiesta de barrio* with a contemporary Miami touch. Ritmos Latinos, the next installment of Little Havana Social Club, will focus on the music and dance of Colombia and the Dominican Republic, showcasing a strong lineup of Miami-based artists.

The multi-talented Humberto Ibarra, a native of Barranquilla, Colombia, has impressive credits, having recorded and performed with artists such as Shakira, Ceelo Green, Joe Arroyo, and Christian Castro. On his first album, *Un Nuevo Comienzo* (2015), Ibarra blended Afro-Colombian and Afro-Cuban rhythms and jazz and featured top instrumentalists such as violinist Alfredo De La Fe and saxophonist Justo Almario. Miami Dade College's 39th-annual Miami Film Festival returns for a ten-day cinema celebration March 4-13 with a hybrid format that combines in-person theatrical presentations and virtual screenings.

Festival executive director Jair Laplante was energized by last year's "collective spirit of joy and gratitude" from "patrons and filmmakers" and is eager to replicate and amplify those feelings with this year's edition — while still taking "all necessary precautions to ensure continued safety. "

As the festival nears the end of its fourth decade of programming, it's clear that the curatorial team remains committed to tradition as well as keeping an eye on the future of the festival, the city of Miami, and cinema.

Consisting of more than 120 films, including feature narratives, documentaries, and short films, representing more than 35 countries, this year's program has something for everyone. The festival continues to spotlight Ibero-American cinema, solidifying Miami's role as a gateway city, both geographically and culturally, between continents.

"We are thrilled to bookend this year's festival with two Oscar shortlist contenders from the Ibero-American world," Laplante says.

Opening night features The Good Boss, Spain's submission for the Academy Awards. Directed by Fernando León de Aranoa and starring Javier Bardem, the film garnered a historic 20 Goya nominations. The festival closes with its awards night and a screening of another Oscar contender — Panamanian director Abner Benaim's Plaza Cathedral, which Laplante calls "one of the year's most beautiful and moving films."

Among the hundreds of films being screened, the Miami Film Festival has chosen a few filmmakers to highlight with special awards. Among this year's honorees are two Precious Gem Awards, which will be presented to Japanese auteur Ryusuke Hamaguchi, who presented not one, but two magnificent films last year with Wheel of Fortune and Fantasy and Oscar-contender Drive My Car, and distinguished filmmaker Ramin Bahrani , who will present his latest documentary, 2nd Chance, at the festival.

Likewise, the Art of Light Award will be awarded to two different recipients. First is composer Cristobal Tapia de Veer, who captured the ears of the world last summer with his fantastic score for the HBO series The White Lotus. Cinematographer Ari Wegner will also collect an award for her wildly different and expertly composed work on the stranger-than-fiction South Florida set Zola and the queer neo-Western The Power of the Dog. In addition to these honorees, the festival will celebrate the work of filmmaker and choreographer Kenny Ortega with an encore screening of A Change of Heart, which premiere at the festival in 2017, and the life of Miami-born Sidney Poitier with a screening of the 1961 film A Raisin in the Sun.

The Miami Film Festival is also looking forward to welcoming back a distinguished group of alumni filmmakers with their latest films, including new works by Carlos Saura, Roger Michell, and Agnieszka Woszczynska. Other films to look out for are Cannes competition titles from François Ozon with his family medical drama Everything Went Fine and Celine Sciamma's lauded modern fairy tale Petit Maman. The festival will bring the long-delayed One Second by Chinese auteur Zhang Yimou, as well. Originally scheduled to premiere at the 2019 Berlin Film Festival, it was mysteriously withdrawn shortly before the premiere. While the official reason was "technical difficulties," many suspect political censorship.

Amid these established cinematic figures, this year's festival has a particular focus on the future through emerging filmmakers. Ready to usher in a new generation, the Knight Marimbas section is for international narrative films "that best exemplify richness and resonance for cinema's future."

Standouts in this group include Francisca Algeria's The Cow Who Sang a Song Into the Future, a magic-realist environmental parable from Chile, and Neptune Frost, from Rwandan filmmakers Anisia Uzeyman and Saul Williams, an Afro-sonic sci-fi musical about a romance between an intersex hacker and a coltan miner that sparks a revolution.

Another group of emerging filmmakers will compete in the Jordan Ressler First Feature section. The Gravedigger's Wife, a gripping tale of life and death from Finish-Somali writer-director Khadar Ayderus Ahmed, will play against Charline Bourgeois-Tacquet's Anaïs in Love, which refreshes the romantic comedy with an exquisite performance by Anaïs Demousier. These two films showcase the amazing variety and diversity among the next generation of cinema found in these sections of the festival.

Connected with a desire to cultivate and discover a new generation of filmmakers, the festival also highlights short films. The Knight Heroes program returns for a fourth year with a change in format and focus. Caitlin Mae Burke and Merrill Sterritt, from Field of Vision's IF/Then Shorts, will lead a group of filmmakers and development executives on a panel, "Scaling a Short Film Into a Short Form Series." Catering to South Florida creatives, the forum is an ambitious and valuable exercise for filmmakers to make their work marketable in an ever-changing media landscape dominated by streaming and fueled by an insatiable thirst for new content and innovative, engaging storytelling.

Several short film competitions also supported this shift toward short filmmaking, including a Latino Short Film Award, a Miami International Short Film Award, a Short Doc competition, and the Florida Student film Cinemaslam competition.

That the work of many Floridan filmmakers can be found throughout the festival demonstrates the festival's continued investment in and promotion of local filmmakers and the infrastructure of the independent filmmaking community. The Knight Made in MIA competition consists of 18 filmmakers of varying practices vying for prizes totaling \$55,000.

In its 39th year, the Miami Film Festival remains highly localized and incredibly international. Both rooted in tradition and ready for the future, the festival remains an integral institution connecting Miami to the exciting world of international cinema.


