

ATI Standardized Exams, Practice Assessments, & Remediation Requirements

Purpose:

The ATI assessments and practice assessments integrated into this course are designed to:

- Provide students with experience in NCLEX-style items and assessment formats.
- Identify content-area knowledge gaps and promote development of clinical judgment, priority setting, and safe nursing practice.
- Guide students in targeted remediation and active learning so that they are better prepared for proctored standardized assessments and ultimately for the NCLEX® exam.

Components:

1. Practice Assessments (proctored and Non-proctored)

- Students will complete two ATI practice assessments during this course (e.g., Practice Assessment A and Practice Assessment B) aligned with the course content.
- Faculty reserves the right to administer practice assessments in proctored environments outside of classroom instruction time.
- Students must complete the associated remediation (Focused Review, Active Learning Templates) and submit documentation (e.g., workbook or remediation log) prior to the next assessment or course milestone.
- Students are allowed only one attempt on Practice Assessment A and Practice Assessment B.

2. Standardized / Proctored Assessment

- At the conclusion of the course (or predetermined point), students will complete a proctored ATI assessment (e.g., Content Mastery Series (CMS) or other standardized version) under test-conditions (See BLSON Testing Policy).
- The program's benchmark for acceptable performance is Level 2 (or equivalent) for this assessment.

Remediation Requirements

- After the ATI practice assessment and end of End of Course Proctored assessments the following must be completed:
- Remediation is individualized and students need to complete **all** of the focused review remediation for a grade of 100%. If a student does not complete the remediation the grade will be 0%. No partial remediation will be accepted.
- **Focused Review:** Students must use the ATI "Topics to Review" report generated by their assessment, complete assigned tutorials, review modules/videos/animations, and hand write all Active Learning Templates assigned by the Focused Review.

- Complete the **Post Study Quiz** if one is generated based on individual results.
- **Documentation:** Faculty will verify completion of assigned remediation. Students must assemble their remediation into a Remediation Notebook (or e-journal) with the following tabs: assessment policy, transcript/report, Focused Review printout, completed handwritten Active Learning Templates, and tutorial records.
- **Time-Minimums:** The Focused Review is individualized and time spent must reflect remediation of the student's score on the practice exam. Recommended time for engagement in the focused review is a minimum of **1 hour** for practice assessments.

ATI Remediation and the End of Course Proctored Exam will account for 10% of the overall grade. The details on how this 10% will be distributed is explained below.

I. ATI Remediation: (4%)

Accounts for 4% of the overall grade. Remediation is required for the items below.

- Practice A Remediation (Gradebook = 0% or 100%)
- Practice B Remediation (Gradebook = 0% or 100%)
- Proctored Exam (Gradebook=0% or up to 100% depending on the level received on the Proctored Exam)

Students who do not take the Practice Exams or the End of Course Exams cannot complete the remediation for that exam and thus will receive a grade of zero for that item.

II. Grading: End of Course Proctored Exam (6%)

The Standardized Proctored Exam is mandatory course requirement which is given towards the end of the course. The student will be assigned an achievement level by ATI. The gradebook will reflect a possible grade of 0% to 100% based on the level achieved on the Standardized Proctored Exam

Expectations & Student Accountability

- Students are responsible for taking all assessments, working diligently on remediation and completing all required components.
- The Practice Assessment, Remediation, and Standardized Proctored Assessment and Remediation are mandatory course requirements.
- All ATI assignments (including the Remediation) must be submitted by the due date indicated, failure to do so will result in a grade of 0%. •
Students must respect test integrity and academic honesty: no sharing of items, posting to public sites, or otherwise violating the proprietary test content.
- All submitted assignments must include the students' name, all handwritten assignments must be completed in pen
