

## Remediation

Remediation is an essential component of student success in nursing education. Evidence supports that targeted remediation—such as content review, test-taking strategies, study skills, and academic coaching—improves student performance and course outcomes (Jeffreys, 2015).

## Student Responsibilities

- **Remediation is Mandatory**
- Students who earn 77% or lower on a course exam or below Level 2 on any ATI exam, including the POP, are required to participate in mandatory remediation.
- Students must contact the **course coach within 48 hours** of:
  - Grades being posted in Canvas,
  - Receiving an ATI score below Level 2 or below the required POP score, or
  - Receiving an email from the course coach requesting remediation.
- Remediation is mandatory. Failure to schedule or attend a remediation session may result in academic consequences.
- Students must complete all remediation assignments by the deadlines established by the coach. **No extensions will be granted.**
- Students are required to follow all remediation recommendations, including assigned work, peer tutoring, and attendance at required student seminars.

## Procedure

- Students who score **77% or below on a course exam** are required to complete remediation with a course coach.
- Students who score **below Level 2 on ATI end-of-course exams or the POP** are required to complete remediation with a course coach.
- The course instructor will document unsuccessful exam attempts and prescribed remediation strategies in the Navigate early alert system.
- The instructor will notify the Remediation Committee Chair and Course Coach of affected students and identified areas of weakness.
- Course coaches will contact students to schedule remediation sessions.
- Students must respond and schedule remediation within **48 hours** of receiving exam results or coach communication. Failure to do so will result in academic consequences
- Remediation sessions may occur **in person or virtually** (camera required).

- Coaches will address identified deficiencies and assign remediation activities as needed. All assignments must be completed prior to the next exam.
- Additional coaching sessions, tutoring, or assignments may be required until the student demonstrates adequate mastery of course content.

### **Consequences for Missed or Noncompliant Remediation**

- Remediation is mandatory. Failure to **schedule a remediation session within 48 hours, attend a scheduled session, or complete assigned remediation activities by the designated deadline** will result in academic consequences.
- A student who fails to schedule or attend a required remediation session will face academic consequences
- Repeated failure to comply with remediation requirements may result in:
  - Placement on an academic action plan, and/or
  - Additional disciplinary action consistent with program policies.
- Noncompliance with remediation requirements may place the student at risk for **course failure** or **program dismissal**, in accordance with the Nursing Program progression policies.
